The Memorial Hall was utilized as a temporary testing site for the community, and its staff, in the name of Zijin Grass volunteer service team, participated in voluntary nucleic acid testing services.

### Headlines

**Nanjing is Making All-out Efforts to Prevent and Control COVID-19 Epidemic.**

On July 20, some staff at Nanjing Lukou International Airport were tested positive during routine nucleic acid testing. A centralized quarantine of related people was soon conducted, and the prevention and control headquarters at provincial, municipal and district levels carried out investigations, tracking, quarantines and nucleic acid tests.

On July 21, Nanjing COVID-19 Prevention and Control Headquarters issued a series of notices, urging citizens not to leave Nanjing unless very necessary, and controlling all kinds of gathering activities and strictly implementing personal protection measures. The notice also announced to conduct city-wide nucleic acid testing, close subway and other public transportation that run through relevant areas, and strengthen the prevention and control on a regular basis.

On July 22, Jiangsu Commission of Health and other departments organized the nucleic acid sampling and testing in Nanjing.

On July 23, Nanjing COVID-19 Prevention and Control Headquarters issued a notice, requiring those who returned to Nanjing via Lukou Airport since July 10 to report to their communities, receive risk assessment and nucleic acid testing, and strictly implement relevant measures including health control and quarantine.

On July 24, the Transportation Control Team of Nanjing COVID-19 Prevention and Control Headquarters announced that from 7 a.m. on July 25, a total of 68 check points would be set up on all roads at city boundaries. Drivers and passengers driving away from Nanjing need to show a green health code and a negative nucleic acid test certificate when passing through the check points.

Nanjing COVID-19 Prevention and Control Headquarters issued No.5 Notice on July 25, announcing that the second round of city-wide nucleic acid testing would be carried out on the city's permanent residents and all people coming into Nanjing from 11 a.m. of July 25.

On July 26, the Transportation Control Team of Nanjing COVID-19 Prevention and Control Headquarters issued another notice that the city's eight long-distance passenger stations would be suspended since midnight of July 27. In addition, taxis (including online car-hailing) are not allowed to leave Nanjing.

On July 27, Nanjing COVID-19 Prevention and Control Headquarters announced that activities in confined places like cinemas were suspended and offline services of training institutions were also suspended. It also announced to strengthen prevention and control management on key groups such as cleaning and security staff.

On July 28, Nanjing COVID-19 Prevention and Control Headquarters issued No.8 Notice requiring the third round of city-wide nucleic acid testing.

Life in Nanjing continues. Food markets and supermarkets have ample reserves. People unite together to carry out epidemic prevention and look forward to an early return to normalcy in Nanjing.



### Information on Memorial's Efforts on Epidemic Prevention

**Staff of the Memorial Hall Participated in Voluntary Services for Nucleic Acid Testing.**

On July 21, a press conference was held in Nanjing to report the COVID-19 prevention and control situation at Lukou International Airport, and announced the city-wide nucleic acid testing as fastest as possible.

Director Zhang Jianjun said, "A museum is a part of its community. The staff of the Memorial Hall should do their best to assist the community in epidemic prevention and testing." In response, our staff cooperated with the community and launched a temporary nucleic acid testing site, and in the name of "Zijin Grass Volunteer Service Team", participated in all kinds of testing work overnight to serve the public.

In the following days, 92 Zijin Grass volunteers went to three nucleic acid testing sites around the Memorial Hall in batches to serve the public as much as they could.



Male staff volunteers took the initiative to serve the testing sites at night and worked until dawn.



At 7 o'clock in the morning on July 26, the relay was taken by another shift of volunteers.

On July 29, Nanjing launched the third round of nucleic acid testing. At the nucleic acid testing site of the Memorial Hall, Zijin Grass volunteers relayed in batches with 24 hours non-stop to provide help for citizens coming to take the test.

The epidemic prevention is still going on. The staff of the Memorial Hall will fulfill their responsibility to serve the community and continue their efforts. Nanjing will surely return to normal.
