





Memorial Hall Held Event to Mark 87th Anniversary


to commemorate the 87th anniversary of the beginning of China's nationwide resistance war against Japanese aggression. A total of 87 representatives, including descendants of Nanjing Massacre survivors, members of the Chinese Young Pioneers organization in Nanjing, some visitors and Memorial Hall staff, attended the event. On July 7, 1937, the Japanese invaders shocked China and the whole world by launching an assault on the Lugou Bridge in Beijing, an event known as the Lugou Bridge Incident. The incident is widely recognized as the start of China's whole-nation resistance against Japanese invaders.


Gao Binghan, a nearly 90 years old lawyer from Taiwan,


was born in Heze City, Shandong Province, China in 1935. At the age of 13, he left his hometown for Nanjing and later moved to

historical denial in the country. He emphasized that this visit


reaffirmed the delegation's belief that Japanese militarists had indeed invaded China and that the Nanjing Massacre truly
